Please be aware that some applications will require review and tags may not be issued on the spot, so plan ahead. All tags must have the 2023 sticker to be considered valid for the season. Starting in 2024 lost tags will require a \$10.00/tag replacement fee, so please keep your tags!! Residents must be up to date on their HOA assessment fees to use the pool. If you have...

Street lights out: To report an inoperable or broken street light, please use Newtown Township's Report a Concern page, or contact the Public Works department at 215-968-2800 extension 246. When possible, please have nearest street address and the pole number available at the time of your call.

Potholes: Use the <u>Report a Concern</u> tool or phone (215) 968-2800 extension 246. A representative will evaluate the damage for repair.

Hazardous waste: The next drop-off is scheduled for 8:30AM-2:00PM August 12 at Bucks County Technical School, 610 Wistar Road, Fairless Hills. To see what is and isn't accepted, read this.

Stray animals: Newtown Township provides animal control services when necessary. If you require such services, please contact the Police Department at (215) 328-8524.

### **Dogs and Cats**

And speaking of stray animals, PLEASE keep dogs on leashes and consider keeping house cats indoors. This is for their own safety as well as for the protection of residents and local wildlife. Please be considerate by picking up after your dogs and disposing of the bags properly. This does NOT mean dropping them in the storm sewers or in a neighbor's trash can.

#### **About Tree Removal on Common Ground**

The Association will remove trees located on common ground that are dead.

Additionally, common ground trees that are severely damaged by storms, uprooting trees, diseased trees that are clearly in decline will be removed. Healthy trees will not be removed by the association just because they are large. Additionally, if branches from a common ground tree extend onto a homeowner's property the homeowner has the right to trim those branches encroaching their property.
